MEMBERSHIP FEES

All children under the age of 18 years must join with an adult guardian to be a member of this club. The adult guardian must hold a social or riding membership with the club. Any additional adults can join as social members if not riders. Membership fees are due on the 1st January each year and expire on 31st December that same year. A \$200.00 non-refundable working bee levy is also payable at that time for any new members and any existing members who did not fulfill their working bee obligation for the previous year. (Detailed below).

Instructors	\$ 126.00 (GPC \$17.88, PCQ \$91.62, PCA \$16.50)
Social Member	\$ 46.00 (GPC \$11.00, PCQ \$35.00)
Social – Life Member	\$ 35.00 (PCQ \$35.00)
Riding – Life Member	\$ 108.12 (PCQ \$91.62, PCA \$16.50)

The Club reserves the right to collect additional fees if Insurance costs increase, to cover over and above the nominated amount advised for 2022.

All membership applications are lodged online at via <https://ponyclubaustralia.com.au/members/> Joining fees are payable online (via JustGo) at the time of application. All new membership applications are tabled for 30 days. The club reserves the right to refuse membership within this period, thus rejecting the membership.

It is a condition of membership that a member from each family, complete 6 hours of canteen duty over the course of the year. If this is not completed, the working bee levy will be forfeited for that year regardless of working bees attended. Exception may be granted to Instructors and Officials that are unable to complete these hours due to other assigned tasks at musters and events.

Please note you are not permitted to enter the grounds at any time with a horse, or ride on the pony club grounds unless you are a financial member of this club.

WORKING BEE FEE

The levy is **\$200.00** and is **non-refundable**.

There will be at least 3 days set during 2022 for working bees. These dates are advised through the monthly muster, and via email, Facebook & the club website. Additional days may be added to the calendar. Riders need to ensure an adult representative from each family is available for a **minimum of 2 working bees (or 10 hours)** or forfeit the levy. In addition to this, a **canteen roster of 6 hours for the year must be completed**. If the minimum number of working bees is attended, and the canteen roster fulfilled, the levy will be rolled over to the following year.

Any new members, who join part way through the year, will still pay the full **\$200.00** levy. This will be rolled over for the following year only if the member has completed a satisfactory amount of work decided by the committee.

Working bees do not include the compulsory 'set up' days which are held the day before events.

In addition, if the set working bees, canteen roster and set up days aren't completed by 31st October of each year you will forfeit your rights and entitlements to end of year trophies.

PIC NUMBERS

Property Identification Codes (PIC) for your property need to be provided from which your horse is

located.

GENERAL

All the instructors give their time at musters to us free of charge, so it is to all riders' benefit to take advantage of their experience and knowledge. We ask all to participate and enjoy these riding musters as much as you possibly can.

Any help from parents, families and friends throughout our busy year will be greatly appreciated.

A ribbon day/fun muster is normally held on the 1st Sunday in November and a breakup will be scheduled for some time in late November. The breakup will include trophy presentation, AGM and a variety of activities. This date will be advised on the internal Facebook group and via email.

CLUB EVENTS

For a member to ride at a club event they need to ensure an adult guardian attends on the set-up day and assists on the event day, otherwise they will not be allowed to compete in that event. You may appeal to the committee to exchange this day for another at the monthly meeting prior to the event. The set-up days are advised at the monthly musters or via email, Facebook & website.

COMPETING OUTSIDE THE CLUB

Any rider intending to compete outside the club must have completed 2 musters in the previous 12 months, as at the day of the competition. Riders must also **notify nominations officer via e-mail the Nomination Secretary or an instructor** prior to the event. This will all go towards points for end of year trophies.

NEW MEMBERS

New riders to the club have the opportunity to participate at one muster before joining the club. To do this you must complete the membership application online prior to attending a muster.

You will be required to pay the membership fees online when lodging the application. Should you decide to not permanently join, provided there are no incidents where the insurance needs to be used, the Club will be able to reject the application and refund the payment.

MUSTERS:

The Club conducts formal musters (or rallies) on the first Sunday of each month, commencing the first

Sunday in February, and finishing the first Sunday in November. During wet weather, lectures will be held in the clubhouse (uniform not required for wet musters). A notice of wet muster will be posted on the internal Facebook page on the morning of the muster.

The uniform for musters must consist of:

- Jodhpurs - plain coloured e.g. black, brown, and navy
- Club polo shirt
- Riding helmet - (3838) or better as per the National Gear Rules
- Club saddle cloth
- Boots

All uniform and gear must be in compliance with the National Gear Rules which can be found at <https://ponyclubqld.com.au/wp-content/uploads/2021/11/National-Gear-Rules-2022.pdf>

Instructors and members must be lined up ready, in front of the canteen in the competition area by no later than the start time of the muster to obtain attendance points.

- Attitude at Musters is considered when evaluating high point trophies.
- Riders may leave the grounds early with approval from the Chief Instructor on that day but unless you attend a full day, you will not receive attendance points. If you decide to leave a muster early, please let an instructor know.
- Riders must be gear checked by the attending instructors before they commence riding at the beginning of the day and after the lunch break, otherwise they will not be allowed to ride and will not receive their points.

Muster points - To qualify for attendance and presentation points you must be lined up and waiting for the instructors by 8am (Summer months) and 9am (Winter months) or you will not be marked for attendance points. You must attend the full day of muster (8am to 2.30pm). Riders will receive marks in 3 categories, which are recorded on an attendance sheet held by the instructors.

These are:

Horse-Care and welfare, presentation, cleanliness, plaited mane and tail etc. Max 10 points

Equipment- Condition and suitability Max 5 points

Dress-Neatness, cleanliness, attire of rider- Max 5 points

TOTAL = 20 points.

As much of this as possible should be done by the child. Instructors will take into consideration the child's age and experience when marking. This is the time for the child to learn and not for the parents to show how well they can do it. The attitude of the rider is also taken into consideration by the instructors for this award. A guide to muster points can be found at the back of the bylaws.

MONTHLY CLUB MEETINGS

Meetings are going to be held on the third Wednesday of each month at the pony club grounds starting at 7.00pm. Details of the meeting are advised at the monthly musters, email, Facebook and website. We encourage all members to attend these meetings to assist in the planning and decision making of all club issues. Persons under the age of 17 years are not to attend these meetings, however they are allowed to form a 'junior committee' at the discretion of the parents to discuss issues important to them and present these issues to the executive committee at a suitably arranged time.

TETHERING HORSES

Horses are not to be tied up by bridles or reins, a halter and lead rope must be used. Special areas have been designated for the tying up of horses; however, horses are never to be tied up to any fences. Yards are also provided on a first come first served basis. Please see instructors if unsure.

SAFETY

As a safety precaution, riders must proceed at a walk unless instructed to do otherwise by an official person within the grounds. Warnings will be issued in this regard. (See below). Spectators and non-assisting members must stay on the perimeter of the competition area behind the fence. Horses are not allowed within the designated canteen area.

Riders must wear the correct helmet and riding boots, whilst riding to and from the pony club, as well as riding on the grounds at ALL TIMES. Riders are not covered by any club insurance if they train at the ground without a pony club instructor and parent/guardian present. Riders must not jump the Showjumping equipment without an adult on the ground (not on horseback). Riders are not to jump the X Country equipment without a Level 1 Coach present. Rider must wear a Safety Vest when jumping X Country equipment.

The picnic area adjacent to the grounds is restricted to pedestrian persons by order of The Logan City Council. Floats and trucks are not permitted to park within this area except by specific arrangement by the Executive Committee on special event days.

Warming up of horses must not take place in the car parking area. Lunging of horses should be performed in the square yard area for safety reasons.

CHILD SAFETY

As required by PCQ we have an elected Child Safety Officer to assist members with any enquiries and concerns relating to Health, Safety and Conduct matters in relation to minors.

We require notification if you do not wish pictures or names to be published of your child/children and for this to be indicated on your membership enrolment forms.

USE OF CLUB VEHICLES AND TRAILERS

The Club owns various vehicles and trailers and due to safety and licensing requirements the following rules apply:

- **Trailers** – no person is to occupy any trailer either inside or on the sides when the trailer is moving, except for an adult unloading the Dressage Arenas during set up/pack down or loading/unloading jump wings.
- **Tractor** – is only to be operated by a Licensed (Provisional or Open) driver who has completed the Club Induction,
- **Ride of mower** – is only to be operation by a person 16 years old and over.
- **ATV** - is only to be operated by a Licensed (Provisional or Open) driver, no more than 3 people and belts much be worn at all times.

Please note adequate PPE must be worn when operation machinery on the Club grounds.

NOMINATIONS

Members are reminded that when they request nominations that must be sent by the club on their behalf, payment must be made at the time the nomination is requested (preferably by direct debit including your name, event date and proof of payment). Also, members are reminded that nominations must be advised to the club allowing for 4 days postage before the closing date. Guardian authority forms must accompany any nomination for riders under the age of 18 years who are not accompanied to the event by their parent/guardian. Please notify nominations officer and list all the requirements you need to provide including a helper.

FORMAL UNIFORMS

The formal Club uniform consists of the following:

- Jodhpurs - Beige must be worn for competition
- Long sleeved white shirt. (Available from Big W, Target, Lowes, etc). Club polo shirts may be worn in the cross country phase of an ODE only
- Black tie and club badge.
- Black or White Riding helmet - (3838) or better as per the National Gear Rules
- Orange Club V neck pullover or vest (optional)
- Club saddle cloth
- Boots – black or brown

All uniform items and gear must be in compliance with the National Gear Rules which can be found at <https://ponyclubqld.com.au/wp-content/uploads/2021/11/National-Gear-Rules-2022.pdf>

ZONE DAYS

Any members wishing to compete at any time within or outside of the zone (area) must obtain permission from a member of the executive committee. Members must be financial at their club before nominating for these events.

Zone 2 Championship events conducted on the 1st muster will be taken as attendance and these days will be used towards the minimum 4 attendance days. Members are responsible for obtaining all their results when attending Zone events and providing them to the person whom collects the points each year. These results will be checked as places may extend to 10th place. Make sure it is clear that the event is held by the Zone, and not by a club in the Zone. Zone uniforms can be purchased by Zone 2 Secretary if required for an event.

CONDUCT AT ALL EVENTS

Rules and regulations regarding “Events” are covered by a book put out by the PCQ and are obtainable on order through the club secretary or are available online at www.ponyclubqld.com.au. You should read and become familiar with the rules for the event prior to competing.

Riders are expected to ride in full Pony Club uniform at all Gymkhanas, One Day Events, Dressage, Showjumping and novelty days. They are expected to keep their shirts tucked in, sleeves worn down to wrists, helmet and boots on while riding and competing. Rolling up of shirt sleeves is not permitted. Club polo shirts may be worn in the cross country phase of an ODE. Mobile phones and/or smoking on a horse are prohibited.

Riders must be in full formal uniform for presentation at the end of the day.

Riders must walk their horses in between events, to and from floats, returning timesheets, etc.

The rule of Pony Club states clearly - **one horse one rider (exception is the ‘2 horse’ rule for some disciplines)**. It is not permissible for any other rider to ride your horse once a competition day has started. This includes doubling. This conduct may find you eliminated for the day and any ribbons won forfeited.

Do not use abusive language to a Judge, or any other person on the grounds.

Cruelty to horses will not be tolerated.

The previously mentioned ‘warnings will apply.

No rider is permitted to exercise their horse on any of the courses before, during or after any events.

Crops are not to be carried under the saddle or in your boots or between your teeth. The penalty for this is immediate elimination. When attending a Zone or State Official Event or for a Memorial Trophy Day, you must form as a Club for the presentation of trophies. If there are eight or less riders, this should be done in half sections. Riders must be neat and tidy and wear full club uniform, club saddlecloth, saddle and bridle. All riders must participate in the March Past.

BEHAVIOUR

Persons entering the grounds are not to use abusive language to Judges, Club officials, Club Instructors, volunteers or riders. All persons found to be using this type of language will be immediately evicted from the grounds and the police will be called if necessary.

WARNINGS

By not adhering to the Club’s riding rules, you will get:

- **FIRST OFFENCE:** Warning advised by Chief Instructor.
- **SECOND OFFENCE:** Suspension on the decision of the Committee advised by the Chief Instructor.

ATTIRE

It is the responsibility of the club holding the event to advise riders they may remove and loosen club uniforms. It is not up to the judges or instructors on the day to make this decision. White long sleeve shirt and tie are compulsory. Members must wear full Club attire when competing in jumping rings and March Past.

CRUELTY

Any cruelty to a mount will not be tolerated, at or during any events or musters. The Club has the right and will exercise this right via a special meeting to vote for a termination of membership without refund of fees. In the event the club exercises this right the club will also apply to PCQ, to have a lifetime ban put on the offending part

INSTRUCTIONAL INFORMATION

All instruction at Pony Club is based on the teaching from the "Riding". This is obtainable on order, from the Secretary. We do have outside instructors provide clinics during the year in disciplines requested by members.

PROFICIENCY AND INSTRUCTORS CERTIFICATES

All members are encouraged to sit for proficiency certificate and/or instructor's certificates. We will test each year for riders who are interested in completing these. We would like to see all junior riders sit for a certificate each year. Please see the Chief Instructor to register your name. C & C* certificates are examined by the Zone in November and at the Zone Camp in April each year. Information on each certificate can be found in the "Syllabus of Instruction" located on the PCA website -

To attend a State Championship, all riders 13 years & over are required to hold a minimum "C" Proficiency Certificate or Level C Instructor's certificate. All riders under 13 years are required to hold a minimum "D" Certificate.

For Instructor certificates, you need to register with PCQ and speak to the Chief Instructor. You are required to attend Zone preschools and instruct at musters throughout the year. Instructor certificates are examined by Zone 2 delegates at the end of each year. Please see Secretary for handbooks.

CANTEEN

The running of the canteen is the responsibility of all club members. One member from each family must complete 6 hours of canteen duty per year. This is usually broken into 3 x 2 hr shifts. If this is not fulfilled, the working bee levy will be forfeited for the year. A logbook will be available in the Canteen for registering your attendance. This will be verified by the Canteen Convener or their delegate on the day. ***Exception may be granted to Instructors and Officials that are unable to complete these hours due to other assigned tasks at musters and events.***

HONORARY LIFE MEMBER

Club members can be nominated throughout the year via the monthly club committee meeting and all nominations are voted on by financial members that evening. Members who are voted in as Life Members will have their names added to the Life Member's shield permanently displayed in the clubhouse. Life members will receive a badge at the trophy presentation. Greenbank Pony Club Inc will pay the single, social membership for the person as long as they stay active in the club.

END OF YEAR TROPHIES

Members are required to attend required amount of set up days, working bees, canteen shifts and attend 4 musters throughout the year to be eligible for the end of year trophies, unless the executive committee grants special permission. This includes our designated internal competition days that may be held at our club on other weekends throughout the year. No other days are to be counted as muster days unless the club clarifies them, in which case the members will be notified via the muster, email or Facebook.

TROPHIES FOR 2022

(Some sponsors for these trophies may be subject to change.)

To achieve attendance points you must be lined up and waiting for the instructors by the start time of the muster or you will not be marked for attendance points, this also attributes to attitude and towards high point trophies.

You must attend and participate in a minimum of 4 musters to be eligible for end of year trophies. PC State, National & Zone 2 Championships will count towards attendance for competitors and family if clashes with a muster including a responsible travel time. Travel time allowance will vary depending on location of the Championship.

Points start from the 1st January 2022 or from when you become a financial member (whichever is later) until the 31st October 2022.

Points must be emailed listing placings achieved, and the horse name you rode. These must be emailed to Jayn Sharrock (GPCmemberpoints@gmail.com) the week after the event otherwise they may not be counted.

Points from events held in October must be given to Jayn by the 31st October or by the day after the event whichever is sooner, or they will not be counted.

Points at official days e.g. Dressage, Jumping, ODE and Combined Training where they have official and unofficial sections will be 10 – 1 e.g. 1st = 10, ... 10th = 1 for those competing official and 5 - 1 e.g. 1st = 5, 5th = 1 for those competing unofficial.

Gymkhana points will only be counted for 1st to 5th place and will be 5 for 1st, 4 for 2nd and so on regardless of how the host club does it on the day. Except for the Zone 2 & State Championship Gymkhana, points will be counted to 10th place as for Official days. Gymkhana results need to be sent in as placing for separate classes as they are separated into Formals, Sporting & Jumping. Overall group placing to 10th (points 10 – 1) will contribute to high point's Zone 2 trophies this will be doubled for the zone Gymkhana.

Points only counted when competing on your nominated Pony Club mount, except if the horse is injured etc. and you have spoken to Jayn about the horse change. Muster points can be collected on another horse to allow for training of new mounts etc, but you need to ride your competition horse at no less than 50% of your attended musters. Need to provide the name of your competition horse to Jayn at the start of the year.

You must let a club official know that you are going to an event otherwise your points for that event won't be counted. Especially now that nominations are done by yourself online.

Listed below is the Clubs Points trophies and a brief explanation of what events are counted towards these trophies.

Points Trophies

The Comet Memorial Perpetual Trophy - Donated by Grace Holden

For attendance, presentation, improvement and general attitude at musters of a junior rider

Greenbank Pony Club Highest Muster Points Trophy - Donated by D Leeds.

For attendance, presentation, improvement and general rider attitude at musters for associates & seniors.

Greenbank Pony Club High Point Formal Trophy

For the junior rider with the highest points for Formal riding (Presentation, Rider, Hack etc) at Official competitions (e.g.: Formal Gymkhanas and Zone 2 Championships and PCQ State events). Open day do not count.

The Agnes Armstrong Perpetual Formal Trophy

For the Associate/Senior rider with the highest points for formal riding at Official competitions (e.g.: Formal Gymkhanas, Zone events and PCQ State events). Open day do not count.

Greenbank Pony Club High Point Junior Sporting Trophy

For the junior rider with the highest points for Sporting (e.g. sporting event held a Sporting Gymkhanas and Formal Gymkhana, Zone 2 Championships and PCQ State events). Open days do not count.

The Agnes Armstrong Perpetual Sporting Trophy - Donated by Mr. and Mrs. Armstrong

For the associate/senior rider with the highest points for Sporting (e.g. sporting event held a Sporting Gymkhanas and Formal Gymkhana, Zone 2 Championships and PCQ State events). Open days do not count.

High Point Jumping Trophy - Donated by the Eleveld family

For the junior rider with the highest points for jumping events at Zone 2 Championships and Official PCQ events and PCQ State events for jumping.

- Under 13 years
- 13 to under 17 years

The D M Nelson Memorial Perpetual Trophy - Jumping - Donated by Mrs. D Leeds

For the associate/senior rider with the highest points for jumping events at Zone 2 Championships, Official PCQ events and PCQ State events for jumping.

Cummins One Day Event (aka Horse Trials) Perpetual Trophy - Donated and sponsored by Cummins Engineering Pty Ltd.

For the 3 different age groups with the highest points in Zone 2 Championships, Official PCQ events and PCQ State event for ODE:

- Under 13 years
- 13 to under 17 years
- 17 years and over

Highest Point Hack Perpetual trophy - Sponsored by Wendy Smith.

For the rider with the highest overall points at Pony Club Hack Shows. The riders must have competed at minimum of 3 Hack days that year.

Hack Runner up trophies - Sponsored by Wendy Smith

For the riders who have the highest overall points in Pony Club Hack Shows but has not won the highest overall trophy. The riders must have competed at minimum of 3 Hack days that year. Beginners days or ring are not included for these unless on lead line.
